1. Introduction

This document outlines the policy and procedures for awarding scholarships and freeships at Rajeev Gandhi Memorial College of Engineering and Technology. Scholarships and freeships are offered to students who demonstrate outstanding academic performance, financial need, or specific achievements.

2. Objectives

The primary objectives of the scholarship and freeship program at Rajeev Gandhi Memorial College of Engineering and Technology are to:

- ❖ Promote diversity and inclusion by providing financial support to deserving students from diverse backgrounds.
- ❖ Encourage participation in extracurricular activities, research, and community service.
- ❖ Alleviate financial barriers and ensure access to quality education.

3. Types of Scholarships and Freeships

The institution offers the following types of scholarships and freeships:

- a. **Merit Scholarships:** Awarded to students based on their academic achievements, such as GPA, standardized test scores, and overall performance.
- b. **Need-Based Scholarships:** Awarded to students who demonstrate financial need based on a thorough evaluation of their family income and resources.
- c. **Special Achievement Scholarships:** Awarded to students who have excelled in specific fields, such as sports, arts, leadership, or community service.
- d. **Research Scholarships:** Awarded to students participating in innovative research projects that contribute to their academic field.
- e. **Freeships:** Full or partial fee waivers awarded to students facing exceptional financial challenges.

4. Eligibility Criteria
